Whites Mix With Negroes on Buses As Segregation Ends in Montgomery

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (UPI)—Racial segregation ended on city buses today, whites on the buses came near downtown. A middle-aged man bringing to a close a pattern in two hours after they had white men in working clothes started early morning runs.

Two Negroes were seated by himself behind the Negroes.

Before the buses were desegregated, Negroes sat to the rear. The white man made no comment.

NO REACTION

Later in the morning a well-dressed Negro boarded a bus at the Court Square stop and sat in front of a white man. There was no visible reaction.

Rev. M. L. King, a Negro minister, alighted from a bus along with Rev. Abernathy, another boycott leader. They said the bus they rode was "pretty thoroughly integrated."

Pastor King, addressing two mass meetings Thursday night as the federal ban on enforcement of city bus segregation laws went into effect, advised his fellow Negroes to give no excuse for violence.

"Violence must not come from any of us," he said.

GIVE INSTRUCTIONS

About 2,500 persons attended the two meetings, where the crowds were instructed how to conduct themselves in riding integrated buses. But King emphasized that "no matter how much instruction is given, this is an area in which you will have to make the decision."

He called on them to pray for guidance.

The boycott began Dec. 5, 1955, in protest to the firing of a Negro seamstress for refusing to move to the rear of a bus. Montgomery's population of about 200,000 includes about 50,000 Negroes.

Already two or three residents in the city have expressed interest in accommodating the immigrants until they get on their feet.

Next meeting of Immigration Department officials and the Citizenship Council will be held in the Immigration Office, Business Block, January 4. All Civic organizations are invited to send a delegate.

A train load of immigrants is scheduled to arrive in Vancouver that day, Mr. Hankinson said today. He urged persons who were willing to take in the refugees to phone either of the above numbers and definitely commit themselves so immigrants can be re-employed before they reach Vancouver and there by save unnecessary expense.

Cypriot Policeman Shot Dead Killers Believed Mere Schoolboys

NICOSIA, Cyprus, (Reuters)—A Greek Cypriot special policeman was shot to death by a terrorist gunman here today at the start of a 24-hour general strike by Greek-Cypriots in protest against a proposed new constitution.

The victim, Jock Hadjiozou, was walking down Ledra Street in the heart of what is known as "murder mile" when a gunman shot him five times from behind. The gunman escaped.

One report said that more than one gunman was involved, and that they were "mere school boys."
