## Duke Snider, Tops Slugging Percentages

NEW YORK (AP)—Duke Snider of Brooklyn Dodgers, the National League home run king, also led in slugging percentage with a .598 figure last season. Joe Adcock of the Milwaukee Braves was next to Snider with a .587 mark in the averages based on total bases divided by total at bats. Others near the top were Henry Aaron of Milwaukee and Frank Robinson of Cincinnati Redlegs, .558 each, and Willie Mays of New York Giants, .557.

Snider also showed the way in total walks, including a record of 26 intentional passes. The old mark for intentional walks was 25 set by Ted Kluszewski in 1955.

Wally Post, one of Cincinnati's leading home run hitters, struck out more times than any other National League player, 124. In contrast, Don Mueller of the Giants, who specializes in place hitting, fanned only seven times. Post, incidentally, hit 36 homers, drove in 83 runs and batted .249. Mueller rapped only five homers, drove in 41 and hit .269.

In the team figures Cincinnati had the best slugging average .441 and Brooklyn drew the most intentional walks, 91, and grounded into the most double plays, 46.

## Plane Search At Low Ebb

VANCOUVER (AP)—The aerial search for a missing North Star and its 59 passengers and three crew members reached a low ebb Thursday when a single RCAP Dakota flew vainly over the Hope area for three hours.

About 50 other search planes were grounded by poor weather. The weather forecast for today, the first day of winter, offered no better prospects in the search for the Trans-Canada Air Lines' plane which vanished Dec. 9 near Hope, 160 miles east of here.

The forecast called for rain and low-lying cloud over the area.

"It may break up about noon but not enough to give good searching conditions," the weather man said.
