
Co-hostesses for the happy occasion were Mrs. Elmer Ritz and Mrs. D. L. Petersen.

Vancouver resident, Capt. J. A. T. Llewellyn, examiner of masters and mates, arrived in the city this morning by boat for a two-day stay.

orange canopy. Drawings of shapely blondes in the briefest of bikinis adorn the walls.

Other wedding notes:

The clock on the Monaco palace tower is five minutes fast. One of Prince Rainier III's subjects thinks it's because "one of his small failings is tardiness—perhaps it's just as well that the palace clock is fast."

The weather man predicts an overcast wedding but a sunny honeymoon. Digging himself out from the worst Riviera winter in recent memory, Bernard Thirion foresees rain and wind for the week up to and including the civil ceremony April 18. But he said there are prospects for a change April 18, and the following days should be sunny and clear.

Ex-king Farouk of Egypt and ex-emperor Bao Dai of Viet Nam

have accepted personal invitations to the wedding. The name of Conrad Hilton, American hotel magnate, also was added to the guest list. President Eisenhower named him his personal representative.
