



To raise partner's overcall, you need exactly what you would need to raise his opening bid—except that three small trumps are ample support. The overfealler may or may not have enough in high cards to have opened the bidding, but he does guarantee the same number of playing tricks which an opening bid! would promise.

A stronger trump suit and better distribution will compensate for any deficiency he may have in the high card depart-
