VAIVES and mothers can do much to promote UN's Peace Package safety, over the holiday season. That is the Christmas message of Mrs. Allan Turner Bone, president of the National Council of Women of Canada, whose remarks on the subject merit quotation in full. She says:

Christmas has always been a time for family reunions, gay parties, and recalling old friends. In addition to being a great religious festival, it has also been a period of traditional jollity. During recent veurs, however, many a Christmas Day in Canada has been marred by reports of death on the highway or in our city streets. And the sad thing is that most of those deaths could have been avoided.

? The wife or mother who lives in constant fear that her husband or children might be the victims of one of these avoidable accidents is certainly not enjoying an old-fashioned Christmas spirit. Yet in many cases, these same wives and mothers are unconsciously contributing indirectly to the very danger they fear. As holiday hostesses, they could make this a safer holiday this year.

Canadian hostesses can do much to add to holiday safety simply by incorporating the following simple rules into their entertainment plans:

•• • Urge guests to leave their cars at home when going to holiday parties. A bus or taxi is much

• For guests who do drive their own cars, suggest that they take a cup of coffee or another hot stimulant for their one-for-the-road drink. Coffee will not make an intoxicated person sober, but it has a generally sobering effect and serving coffee or another alertness beverage to departing guests helps to remind them that they should drive carefully.






