

Sedgwick Sets New High In Pacing Grotto Wins

Jack Sedgwick of Grotto Cigar Store in "A" division of the Men's Five Pin Bowling League captured new honors by rolling high single game of the year with 337 in Monday night's play and thereby paced his team to a run-away lead in establishing new team records of 1,241 for team high single and 3,289 for team high triple.




WEATHER THE VILLAIN
