

Two Local RCMP Officers To Be Transferred Soon

RCMP staff changes, one in the sub-division offices and one in the city detachment will see two senior NCO's with long service here leave some time in the future for diversified sections of the province. Affected by the changes, announced today by Inspector W. Taylor, officer commanding in the Prince Rupert sub-division, will be Staff-Sgt. T. A. Stewart, senior NCO at sub-division and Sgt. H. L. Norman, NCO in charge of the city RCMP detachment.

Jaycee-Ettes Vote in Favor Of Fluoridation

The newly-formed Prince Rupert Jaycee-Ettes, went on record this week as favoring fluoridation of the city's water supply. The move came Monday night at a meeting held at the home of Mrs. Vern Clecone, president, 1727 Sixth Avenue East, after an "open" city council meeting had shown the film "A Drop in The Bucket."

The Jaycee-Ettes plan to get in touch with the Prince Rupert Children's Preventative Dental Clinic and Parent-Teacher Association in the city with a view to presenting a united front when the matter is brought before city council.

Mr. Hiebert, as regional director for the Junior Chamber of Commerce installed the Jaycee-Ettes executive which is composed of Mrs. Vernon Clecone, president; Mrs. G. P. Woodside, vice-president; Mrs. J. S. Burns, secretary and Mrs. Ben Craft, treasurer. The director then outlined the duties of the executive to the membership. Also approved during the evening was the group's new constitution. The Jaycee-Ettes will stage a pot-luck supper April 2, at a site yet to be decided.

The routine transfer will see Staff-Sgt. Stewart go to Nanaimo and Sgt. Norman to Vernon. Staff-Sgt. Stewart served 14 years with the provincial police before he transferred to the federal force in August 1950 with the rank of corporal. He was made a sergeant in December of that same year and returned to serve in Prince Rupert in 1951.

Sgt. Norman, who completes 25 years police service on April 1 this year, joined the provincial police in Prince Rupert and has been an NCO for the past 13 years. He came back to Prince Rupert in November 1952 after serving in the Peace River, Vancouver, Ashcroft, Hope, Ocean Falls, Campbell River, Port Alford and other locations. Sgt. Norman transferred to the RCMP in August, 1950 and served in the Vancouver headquarters before being stationed back in Prince Rupert.
