

Eden Faces Biggest Test Since Taking Over Reins

LONDON (AP)—Parliament came back from vacation today with a barrage of questions for Prime Minister Eden ranging from Red spying to royal romance.

Even heavier cahoonading is likely Wednesday when P. A. Butler, chamberlain of the exchequer, presents a supplementary budget designed to cut inflationary trends with a heavy dose of austerity.

As the House of Commons returned from a recess which began Sept. 29, Eden faced his greatest testing time since he succeeded Sir Winston Churchill last April as the leader of the Conservative government.

Interest centred on these two areas of inquiry:

- What action, if any, has the government in mind to dispel the mystery of Princess Margaret's romance with Peter Townsend?
- The case of Guy Burgess and Donald Maclean, the turncoat British diplomats who fled to the Soviet Union in 1951 just a jump ahead of their exposure as Red spies.

TALK OF MARRIAGE ACT

Labour member Marcus Lipton has asked whether the government intends to seek a repeal of the Royal Marriage Act of 1772. The act interposes a number of time consuming obstacles to the marriage of the princess, third in line to the throne, to Townsend, handsome divorced companion.

Any statement by Eden that repeal of the act is under consideration would be taken by most people as proof that Margaret has made up her mind to become Town end's bride despite the objections of the Church of England.

The pro-Conservative Daily Sketch declares that "the welter of little tattle and speculation all over the world about Princess Margaret has grown to such extent it threatens the dignity of the crown."

The Daily Express says: "Margaret's royal relatives have been putting a deep chill on Townsend, adding that he has not received even informally by either the Queen or the Duke of Edinburgh since his return from his diplomatic post in Belgium 12 days ago. It adds that Queen Mother Elizabeth, who shares the Clarence House residence with Margaret, has talked with him only briefly."
