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NOW AT YOUR DRUGGISTS

Ever Since Eve

IF, DURING YOUR FALL CLEAN-UP this year, you're doing any painting, save leftover paint in small airtight jars clearly labeled with the room they're for. Then, when nicks or stains appear, stir paint thoroughly and use for a perfectly matched touch-up job.

APPLE PIE IS WONDERFUL served hot—and, whether you serve it fresh from the oven or re-heated, do it some time before serving, sprinkle top crust with grated cheese, return to oven until cheese starts to melt.

MEAT LOAF IS AN EXCELLENT supper suggestion for football enthusiasts—and, for just such an occasion, try shaping your loaf like a football. Then place on a shallow baking pan and arrange pimento strips on top in lacing fashion.

KEEPING A SCARF PERFECTLY draped or tied is a bit of a trick. Photographic stylists pin its ends to the model's brassiere or slip straps. Pins don't show, and no matter how much twisting and turning, the scarf won't shift from its original position.

TO PICK UP BROKEN GLASS or fine dust, use smooth piece of paper—newspaper or magazine—wet one edge, place edge on floor, sweep up glass, then throw paper and contents away.

FOR A SNACK SOME TIME, try Melba-toast rounds spread with tartar sauce. Easy to prepare and taste wonderful.

TO BRIGHTEN COLORS DULLED BY dust film that forms on household textiles, sponge the rug's surface occasionally with synthetic detergent—1 ounce to a gallon of water. REMEMBER though, it should be "sponged," not soaked, and it must be done evenly or rings will appear. Shampooing is not recommended; it may rot the backing and cause unevenness.

FOR NORMAL everyday cleaning of woolen rugs, best results can be obtained by using a vacuum cleaner. Finish by running the machine in the direction the pile lies. Depending on the rate of soiling in your

neighborhood, one thorough cleaning and several light cleanings a week are recommended.

MAKE A HABIT OF vacuuming the back of rugs every six months.

A MORE THOROUGH brightening can be achieved with a powder cleaner, one with a sawdust or absorptive clay base. Use a fresh, slightly moist powder cleaner. "Scrub" it into the carpet; then vacuum thoroughly.

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
