Mizell, Cards' Batting Strength Put St. Louis in NL Second Place

Wilmer (Vinegar Bend) Mizell and St. Louis Cardinals finally are giving the big ploughboy some runs and he's delivering complete games. It could be a whole of a combination in the National League pennant race. The Cards have produced 25 runs for the drawing left-hander in his last three starts. He's won 'em all and all were complete games.

He got his fifth victory in seven decisions this season by flashing his stuff past potent Cincinnati for a 9-3 breeze Thursday night. The victory lifted St. Louis back into second place, a game behind Milwaukee Braves, who kept up their home run hammering in a 15-8 frolic against Chicago Cubs.

Pittsburgh Pirates moved into third with a 3-0 job on New York Giants. In the American, New York Yankees made it three straight over Washington, winning 9-6 on five unearned runs as Mickey Mantle went hitless in four trips. Boston beat Baltimore 4-1 on Bob Porterfield's four-hitter in the only other AL game.

Mizell, a 25-year-old service returnee, never had it so good with the Cards. The Cards gave him plenty of working room Thursday night, piling up an 8-0 lead in two frames off starter-loser Art Fowler and Hal Jefferson.

Wilmer breezed through on a two-hitter for eight innings. Then in the ninth Gus Bell, Ted Kluszewski and Frank Robinson hit consecutive home runs.

The League-leading Angels came apart at the seams as they bowed to the league doormats. Mounties are in eighth spot, still 17 1/2 games out of first place.

In other games, second-place Sacramento downed seventh-place Hollywood 6-2; third-place Seattle edged fifth-place San Diego 4-3 in 11 innings and sixth place Portland defeated the 4th place San Francisco Seals 3-0.

At Los Angeles, the Mounties walloped seven Angels pitchers for 16 hits, while three of their own hurlers gave up 12 hits.

Mounties move to San Diego today for a night game. Seattle is at Hollywood, Portland at Sacramento and Los Angeles at San Francisco.


