New Lighting, Stage Feature Dance Revue

A new arena-type stage and unusual lighting effects will combine with the talent of the 230-member cast of the Civic Centre School of Dancing tonight to make the 1956 version of "Sweethearts on Parade" an even bigger hit with first nighters in the Civic Centre gymnasium.

The dazzling show, directed and produced by dancer director Buddy Taft, received an enthusiastic reception yesterday afternoon from a whistling and clamoring audience of school children.

The two-and-a-half hour revue will be presented tonight and tomorrow night, with curtain time scheduled for 8 p.m. Highlighted by gorgeous costumes, painstakingly made by mothers of the dancing school pupils, the show is a result of a great deal of co-operation.

The new stage which can be viewed from three sides, gives the audience a closer contact with the entertainers and the lighting is the handiwork of members of the Prince Rupert Little Theatre association. Robert Hill and James Cunningham have been in charge of arranging the multi-colored lights and yesterday afternoon Geraldine Procter did a commendable job of operating them.

The 1956 "Sweethearts" includes brand-new numbers and routines for its ballet, tap, toe and aerobic dancers. All costumes are original and the result of many months hard work. Numbers have been perfected only with patience and many trying rehearsals and the co-operation of pianists Mrs. Floyd Eby, Donald MacDonald and Keith De Witt.

As well as solos such as "Pettie Miss" featuring tiny Leslie Cook and duets starring Camille Musalem and Margaret Parlette in "Sunbonnet Sue" there are lively quartettes, group acts such as the colorful and fast-paced John Peel number with its red-coated "riders." The Production numbers include Indian Ceremonial dances and the exciting "Arabian Nights" which is presented by a cast of more than 30 dancers.

Acting as master of ceremonies for the show is Harley Lewis who also adds vocal color to the finale when director Buddy Taft introduces his "show stopping" Folie à Deux.

Tasty "Rainbow Salad" Really Lives Up To Name

Rainbow salad really lives up to its name. Lime-flavored gelatin, golden canned cling peach slices, a few bright red strawberries and some snowy cottage cheese combine their tints beautifully and their flavors deliciously. There won't be any of this good salad left on the plates.

- Rainbow Salad**
- 1 package lime-flavored gelatin
 - 1 cup hot water
 - 1/2 cup cold water
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 - 1/2 cup mayonnaise
 - 1 cup large curd cottage cheese
 - 1 cup halved strawberries
 - 1/2 cups canned cling peach slices

Salad greens
 Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Blend in cold water, salt and lemon juice. Add mayonnaise, and beat until smooth with rotary beater. Turn into refrigerator tray and place in freezing compartment 15 to 20 minutes, until mixture is set about 1 inch in from sides, but soft in center. Turn into bowl and beat again until smooth and fluffy. Fold in cottage cheese, strawberries and well-drained peach slices. Spoon into individual molds, and chill until firm. Unmold on salad greens to serve.
 Makes 8 (6-ounce) molds.
