SOUCHAK STAGES COMEBACK TO CAPTURE CALIENTE OPEN

TIJUANA, Mexico (4) - Power-hitting Mike Souchak, with a gallant come-from-behind performance, captured the \$12,500 Caliente open golf tournament Sunday with a final round 71 and a 72-hole score of 281.

The popular, 28-year-old Souchak clipped one stroke off par 72 and was seven under regulation figures for the distance in a rousing duel with tall Tommy Bolt, the leader by two strokes going into the final round.

Bolt finished two strokes behind Souchak, registering a disappointing 75 for 283.


