

One of the most difficult assignments a young baseball player faces is that of learning to judge the distance a ball will travel

when it is hit by a batter. Start out by having some one toss balls in the air to you. When you can catch these tosses regularly, have a batter hit fly balls in front of you, to your right and left and finally in back of you as

you learn to judge the flight of the ball. With enough practice you may learn to turn your back on a long fly, run to the point where it will come down, and turn and make the catch an great outfielders like Jimmy Piersall, Duke Snider, Willie Mays, Jim Busby, Richie Ashburn and Mickey Manile do. To help them judge how far and in what direction a ball will travel, they check the wind every inning, glancing at flags, tossing grass into the air, wetting a finger or using other methods which show wind direction and strength.

Never catch a hall with one hand if you can use two.
