



Michigan Top Favorite In U.S. Press Ballot

NEW YORK OR — Michigan, Oklahoma, its winning string building for its first U.S. title now stretched to 22 games, remained in third place, followed by general shakeup that listed Notre Dame, George Tech, Wisconsin, Texas Christian, Navy, UCLA and West Virginia in that order.

Michigan proved its comeback as a national power by humiliating Army 26-2 Saturday. It was the third game of the season for the unbeaten Wolverines and it convinced the experts.

Wolverines were accorded top billing by a healthy 200-point margin over Maryland, which gathered a 4-0 record by whipping Wake Forest 28-7.

They haven't been better than fourth since.

BREAK DETROIT JINX

The first two wins were over Chicago and Detroit on enemy ice. Last season they didn't win a game in Detroit.

That, Mr. Watson, is what is surprising.

"Maybe so," said Watson, "but this team is just like the Rangers in the days when they were scaring the rest of the league to death. Just wait and see. Everyone on the team is in great shape. Everyone wants to play and no one wants to lose."

Watson, who played with some fine Ranger teams when he was in action, took over the coaching reins from Muzz Patrick. Muzz became general manager when Frank Boucher quit at the end of last season.

MURPHY PRAISED

Watson singled out Ron Murphy for special praise.

"I want him to score 20 goals this season," said Watson with a trace of a smile. "I realized how tough it might sound to a player, so I put it to him this way: 'It wouldn't be asking too much to score four goals a month, would it?'

"It doesn't sound like so much that way. He's got his four already. So now I'm asking him to make it four a game."
