

NICOSIA, Cyprus (Reuters) — British troops charged with clubs and fired over the heads of shouting demonstrators in Limassol today shortly after a British officer was killed in a separate outbreak at

Anti-British revolt wracked this Mediterranean island colony as Rescue Unit Greek Cypriots demonstrated lagainst Tuesday's decision to execute two convicted terrorists.

Five bombs exploded in Limassol as hundreds flinging stones and bottles demonstrated against the decision to hang the two. British troops opened fire on one street as the bombs exploded in nearby side streets.


