Pie Filled With Peaches Speedy No Bake Affair

Fresh, Juley, ripe peaches are combined in this ple with whipped cream and gelatin for a light filling to spread in a crisp no-bake Corn Flakes Crumb Crust. The ple requires chilling and is then ready to serve.

Notice the peaches are sliced, rather than crushed, which is the only way to use fresh peaches to retain their delicate sweetness.

PEACH CHIFFON PIE

Corn Flakes Crumb Crust 3 cups Corn Flakes

4 cup butter or margarine

2 tablespoons sugar Crush corn flakes into fine crumbs. Blend butter and sugar. Stir in corn flakes crumbs. Press evenly and firmly around sides and bottom of 0-inch pie pan. Chill. Peach Chillon Filling

1½ cups sliced fresh peaches % cup sugar

1 tablespoon unflavored

½ cup boiling water tablespoon lemon juice 1's leaspoon salt ½ cup whipping cream

1/4 cup cold water 2 cgg whites Sprinkle peaches with sugar and allow to stand for 30 minutes. Boften gelatin in cold water; dissolve in bolling water; stir in lemon juice and sail. Combine with peaches. Chill until mixture begins to set. Whip cream until stiff. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold whipped cream and beaten egg whites into gelatin mixture. Spread in chilled Corn Flakes Crumb Crust. Let stand until sirm, Garnish with additional sliced peaches if desired.
