
## Birth Filmed For TV Program

# SS Louise To Replace "Queen" During Overhaul Next Week

VANCOUVER — SS Queen of the North, formerly the Princess Norah will be withdrawn from Vancouver-Ketchikan service on Monday, March 12, for annual overhaul. It has been announced by British Columbia Coast Steamships. Following arrival at Vancouver next Monday, the vessel will proceed deadhead to Victoria where she will be laid up until further notice.

SS Princess Louise, which has been relieving ship on the CPR's Vancouver-Victoria-Seattle route, will take over the duties of the Queen of the North, commencing with the 3 p.m. sailing from Vancouver on March 13.

Vancouver-Victoria-Seattle service will be resumed by SS Princess Joan on March 12, when that vessel resumes operations after annual overhaul.


