

MANUFACTURERS' GROUP CHIEF SAYS BUDGET 'DISAPPOINTING"

TORONTO @ -- The federal budget was described Tucsday night as "disappointing" by T. A. Rice of Hamilton, president of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association:

Finance Minister Harris' decision "to stand pat" on last year's tax rates indicated that he has been won over by the argument that tax culs are necessarily inflationary, Mr. Rice. -commented.

The validity of this argument had been denied by the steadiness of the consumers' price index since the "conservative" tax cuts in the 1955 bug .et.

The association welcomed the government's policy in treaties with certain foreign countries "whereby a greater". participation in foreign-controlled companies will not bring such beavy Canadian tax penalties."
