Rainiers Coast Loop Champions

Pacific Coast League action switched to the conference table Monday, after Sunday's wrap-up of the season, but two clubs have yet to make their last outs.

Seattle, which clinched the pennant Saturday with a 3-1 victory over Los Angeles, split with the Angels Sunday, losing 9-0 after a 4-3 victory. San Diego, last year's pennant winner, clinched second place by taking a 6-5 nightcap from Hollywood, which had won the opener, 7-6.

This left the Stars and the Angels in a tie for third place. Under league rules ties are broken with a one-game playoff, but the two clubs are playing a five-game series anyway for the City championship. So they asked the league directors, meeting in Seattle Monday, to let the whole series act as a tie-breaker.

Portland closed the season by beating seventh-place Oakland twice, 6-5 and 5-2.

Boxers Seek Former Glory This Week

NEW YORK (AP)—Boxing's comeback trail is jummed this week. Three former champions and two heavyweights who were the one-two contenders only a short while ago are among the top fighters featured on the week's boxing program.

Tony DeMarco, who lost his welterweight crown to Carmen Basilio June 10, returns to action Wednesday for the first time since that knockout defeat. He meets ambitious Chico Vojar, winner of seven straight and unbeaten in his last 12, in the Boston Garden.

The winner may get the next title crack at Basilio.

Johnnie Saxton, who lost his crown to DeMarco April 1, opposes Joe Shaw of New York at Portland, Me., Thursday night.

Willie Pep, the one-time featherweight king, meets Jimmy Ythia of New York in a flood relief benefit show at Hartford, Conn., Tuesday.

Nino Valdes, giant Cuban heavyweight, who was the No. 1 contender until he lost to Archie Moore and Bob Satterfield, takes on England's Don Cockell Tuesday night in a 10-round in London's White City Stadium.

Egan to Coach
WHL Canucks

VANCOUVER (CP)—Martin Joseph (Pat) Egan, a hockey veteran of 14 years and nearly 1,000 games, Saturday was named coach of Vancouver Canucks in the Western Hockey League.

Egan, who came from Providence of the American Hockey League, will take over pilot duties from Art Chapman, who moves to the business side of the sport this year.

At 37, Egan has completed the circle in returning to the WHL, the league he left in the 1938-39 season to start his professional career with Springfield of the AHL.

Eleven years of uninterrupted play in the National League followed his half-season in the AHL.

His NHL travels took him to New York, to Detroit and then to Boston for a six-year stretch.
