

## Men, Women, Children Fight on in Hungary

BELGRADE (AP)—Hungarian men, women and children threw themselves with renewed fury today into heavy fighting against the Russians in stricken Budapest, informed sources in the Yugoslav capital reported.

The fighting was described as "about as intense as it was when the anti-Russian, anti-Cominunist revolt began October 23."

Informants said extremely heavy firing blasted continuously throughout Monday and Monday night and rose in intensity in the daylight hours.

While there appeared to be no hope for the revolution, a prospect that for some time to come Hungary would be in for a period of bitter guerrilla warfare faced the Balkan country.

In Budapest women darted into the streets and threw grenades at Soviet tanks and others sniped at the Russians from the windows of build-
