

# Hotel Splits With Terrace

## Takes Opener 10-7 Drops 2nd Game 7-6

Commercial Hotel split a double header with Terrace yesterday at Roosevelt Park, winning the opener 10-7 and dropping the evening encounter 7-6 to fall back into a tie with idle Gordon and Anderson for league first place in the only senior baseball encounter of the weekend.



SEATTLE — The 54th Pacific Northwest Golf Association tournament opened here today with the area's top golfers gunning for the crown won last year by Bob Fleming of Victoria.

The low eight qualifiers will begin 36-hole match play on Friday and Saturday. The championships are slated Sunday.

The Prince Rupert Senior Softball League began to take shape over the weekend, with three games being played to fair-sized crowds in good weather.

Featured in the three games which saw the debuts of Local 807 and Port Edward teams, were a total of 68 runs, 62 hits and 29 errors in fielding.

Saturday night Local 708 made an auspicious entry into the new loop with a convincing 14-8 victory over Atlin.
