

Second Bulganin Appeal For Treaty Fails To Melt American Opposition

WASHINGTON — A new U.S. official called Bulganin's appeal from Premier Bulganin a new message mainly a rehash of failed today to melt United States opposition to a Soviet-American "friendship treaty," and said he had not advanced persuasive new ideas. Eisenhower, in a letter last Saturday, had told Bulganin which the U.S. government holds to be needless and perhaps risky.

In a 2,000-word message made public by the state department here late Thursday night, Bulganin urged President Eisenhower, in a letter last week, to renew the 20-year pact proposed by the Russian premier last week and promptly end his argument that "deeds not words" are needed to ease East-

West tensions, and sought to turn it back on Washington.

COURTEOUS ANSWER — without naming State Secretary Dulles, he called the secretary's "brink of war" statement in a Life magazine article provocative, and said American moves to build up air bases around the Soviet Union create "fully understandable apprehension" among the Russians.

Bulganin said he thought Eisenhower would agree that the conclusion of a treaty of friendship and co-operation between the two strongest powers in the world would contribute enormously to a healthier international situation."

Officials said his letter would be answered in the same courteous vein which has characterized the exchange of almost half a dozen personal messages between the two leaders since the Geneva "summit" conference last July.

But they noted that as recently as Wednesday, Eisenhower had joined with Prime Minister Eden in a declaration cautioning neutrals in the cold war to beware of Red "entanglements." Eden and Eisenhower also asserted that Soviet policy still is bent upon world conquest.

The increase raises the bonus to \$20 monthly, highest in Canada. It becomes effective April 1.

Under a new ruling the provincial government has removed its "other income" ceiling for bonus payments from pensioners in the 65-70 group. Previously all extra earnings were deducted from the bonus.

Under the federal restrictions a pensioner is allowed \$10 monthly outside income. Anything above that amount is deducted from the basic pension. The provincial bonuses are not counted as outside income, however.

In the over-70 group, which receives the \$40 pension automatically, there will still be a provincial means test for the bonus.

Premier Bennett, announcing the increased bonus in the budget speech Wednesday, said B.C. will ask Ottawa to double the limit on extra income to \$20 monthly for the 65-70 age pension recipients.
