BOSTON (C) A routine arrest Two men were arrested in Boston more has led to what is now charged with being access to the first big recovery of \$100,000 from the \$1,200,000 Brinks robbery or more than six years ago. Mr. Dale won with the ace and returned the 10. Here Mr. Champion made one of his typically brilliant plays. He went up with the king.

There was excellent reasoning back of this play. The correct opening lead from three small cards in partner's bid suit is the highest card. The correct lead from a holding of three to an honor is the lowest card.

If the opening lead had been the eight of hearts, Mr. Champion would have figured Mr. Muzzy's actual holding correctly. But since the lead was the deuce, he figured Mr. Muzzy for three hearts to the queen. On this reasoning, if he played the jack of hearts at trick two Mr. Muzzy would win with the queen and return a third heart to clear the suit.

However, if he went up with the king, Mr. Muzzy would be left with the lone queen and that would block the suit.

Confidently then, Mr. Champion led the queen of clubs at trick three, as he had to win the ace and ruffled off three fast heart tricks to put the hand down one.

"Dale," stormed Mr. Champion, "if you can't teach your partner how to make correct opening leads, we won't have a chance."

"How did my lead work out on this deal?" Mr. Muzzy inquired and his question did nothing for the team's morale.

## Outdoors with Marty

So now we have further proof of the efficiency of the Jig, another semi-skeptic joins the ranks of the confirmed. Dick Farmer this time, and a sixty pound halibut from deep water on an artfully handled Tee spinner was his ample reward.

Onlookers are still amazed at the way the small hooks stayed put to defeat this whopper, but here is where playing a weighty adversary proves better than horning. Good work Dick!

The lads at Fairview had fun with the dolles over the weekend. Fishing very light table at low slack (actually the tide state matters little for dolles) and using half-inch cubes of halibut as bait, with a very small lead, bright trout from 13 to better than 20 inches were taking right along. Anglers working from the top of the ramp were able to see fish immediately below, but an occasional fish was lost on the long trip aloft. The float fisherman can do good work here from water level, by bending or a float about five feet above a small number six hook, and not more than a single buckshot as sinker; the use of a float will permit the waterlevel angler to cast amongst the fish (which same frequently hang around the pilings) and keep his lure before them until taken.

Do not let the murky appearance of the water prevent you fishing, the water is full of trout bits from the packing plant and it is precisely these bits of feed that keep the fish around.

Now that rods are receiving so much usage, here is a tip. When attending to your terminal tackle or dehooking a fish, do not, repeat do not, lay the rod down. Find some place to stand it up or carry a common three inch nail to stick in some convenient timber, then rest the rod against it. One of these times when a bunch of interested people crowd around to watch your sport, and a valuable rod gets stepped on, then you will see what I mean!

One other thing, keep your rod guide windings covered with adhesive tape, scotch tape will do for a short protection period too.

Anglers going up country for some fishing need not worry too much if waters are swift and off color. The dry fly man may not do so well, but your columnist has found that a brass or copper spinner (not over shiny at the) will account for trout and salmon in water as dark as the Skeena is right now. Fish deep and slow, and remember that friend fish is in its element anyway, and has never been known to go blind just because water is roily!
