For the third time he set the world record of 3:58 at Turku, moved away near the finish. Finland, on June 24, 1954, Landy . Landy said later he was only burst through the four-minute "reasonably satisfied" with his barier here today to win the Vic-time. torian state mile in 3:58.6—the second fastest mile on record.

Since Britain's Roger Bannister ran the first four-minute mile just over two years ago, be able to run a mile in 3:55 or what was once regarded as the unattainable goal of the track and field world, has been reached! eight times in five races. Bannister did it twice --- the


