SIGNIFICANT BACKGROUND

We look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen." (2 Cor. 4:18.) It's not true that certain people have no background. Everyone has a background of some kind and it goes a long way in defining many things in their lives. In fact we can form no judgment of people unless we take account of their background.

Conclusion that many reached about the Vancouver "hoodlums" is that there is something wrong in their round — some failure in them, some neglect in home life, some poisoned spring flowing through like a hidden well into the well.

I will agree that most of us would be surprised to hear these teenagers come from such kind of homes, or youth groups — it does so — but so rarely that we expect it. Character and life find their roots in right round.

live with our background. The mental pictures, hopes and fears continually thrust themselves forward for me to see. I would divide these backgrounds broadly into two types. First type is occupied by things that are seen, such as limited horizons of work, as well as pain and fear — physical existence, folk of this horizon to target salmon. The tag is little except that it's irritating than enlightening.

Second type includes "not seen," or limitless possibilities where seen things in the light of examples under the over-arching purpose and mercy of God. It is why attitudes and in regard to gambling, and business samples seem so much foolishness with the limited view. point is, that the latter round only comes through education. It is not surprising delinquent or neglectful so often produce delinquencies — it's a failure background.
