Fair Practice?

MAANAGEMENT has firmly maintained its prerogative of bargaining with union representatives on pertinent phases of contract agreements. But the frec-wheeling Social Credit government in a speedy legislative move has stripped management of one of its contract bargaining points, says Industrial Report, formerly the B.C. In substance, the magazine says, the passage of this labor legislation usurps the employer's previously held right to bargain on the issue (in excess of one week holiday with pay) with labor union leaders. As a result, the government moved quietly and almost unnoticed into the management-labor field of contract bargaining.

Though representatives of employer and management associations were duly informed on appearing before Labor Minister Lyle Wicks that they need have no worries as far as any pending "holiday with pay" legislation was concerned, it was, nevertheless, passed quickly over the heads of employers without and health scheme, coast giving them advance notice of the legislation, or the opportunity to peruse and present their views on it.






