

## J. Christensen, TV Producer, Home Today

Coming home today for a well-earned rest is a Prince Rupert man who by hard work and study has attained a position where he can not only rub shoulders with the high and the mighty but have some fun out of his job as well.

Arriving on the Prince George this afternoon is John Christensen, technical producer with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation television station CBTU in Vancouver. Mr. Christensen is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Christensen, 885 Borden Street.

Born in this city in 1927, John Christensen was educated at Borden Street and Booth Memorial schools and graduated from the Radio College of Canada, in Toronto in 1950. So high were his grades that Mr. Christensen was chosen from his class to stay with the CBC as a technician. In 1951 he was assigned to Ottawa to televise the Royal tour when Queen Elizabeth, then Princess, visited Canada with the Duke of Edinburgh.

Transferred to the Pacific Coast in the fall of 1953 Mr. Christensen became the first television producer on the west coast to use live pictures.

In charge of CBTU's mobile unit, Mr. Christensen covered the swimming events of the British Empire Games at the new Empress pool at UBC. He and his crew took all the CBC's shots of the Duke of Edinburgh on his recent Vancouver visit, and also those of the Archbishop of Canterbury. Also keeping him busy are assignments covering Vancouver lacrosse, football and track events.
