Operation Skeena Succeeds

AV/HEN a group of mill operators in the Terrace area decided last summer to start exporting lumber to overseas markets via Prince Rupert there was no way of telling just how the experiment would work out. During the war when Terrace lumber was in demand in Britain, it was shipped east by rail and the U.K. stood the heavy freight cost. So not only was there no precedent to go by, but there was a potentially serious problem in the lack of a modern assembly yard. This meant Act. that railway cars had to be loaded at each mill where facilities were limited.

Although the assembly yard problem has not yet been licked, it is clear by now that the experiment is a success. For the first four months just one export firm handled selling for the group. Now there are several. The project has taken hold and those in it are now in a position to anticipate expansion.

One who can best see the possibilities is Elmer Mitchell, manager of John P. Herber & Co. which originally had sole charge of export arrangements. "They've been shipping about 1,000,000 board-feet a month," he said of the group, called the Skeena Export Sales Ltd. "But 5,000,000 a month is foreseeable. Three million could be achieved quite easily by stepping mills up to two shifts."

From Prince Rupert's point of view it is also encouraging to note that Mr. Mitchell foresees greater use of this port for lumber export in general. Observing that other points farther east on the line are shipping as much lumber through here as Terrace, instead of their former practice of shipping exclusively east by rail, he says, "More lumber production for export can be expected to use Prince Rupert as a shipping port. This is due to many factors. For one, Anglo-Canadian Shipping Co. set the pace by gambling on the entire northern project. They assessed extra teaming time, taught longshoring and so forth. Even now, some ships make a joint cargo from Rupert and Watson Island, five miles from Rupert, picking up pulp from Columbia Cellulose.

"With new exports moving in, more sawmills in the district will get in on Operation Skeena and there will be more business for everyone."

So the outlook for all concerned is bright and the Terrace operators are to be commended for their foresight in opening up such a valuable avenue of trade. Now if a modern assembly yard canbe established—and no effort or help should be spared to see that it is—the opportunities for an efficient and successful operation are unlimited.


