WATERFOWL HIGHWAYS-Bird migration in North America is more than a mere north-and-south movement. Ornithologists recognize four major migration routes-the Atlantic,

Each flyway has its own population of ducks, geese and other migratory birds. It has breeding and wintering grounds and a complex system of its own migration routes.

The Atlantic flyway, route of the Canada goose, Atlantic brant and black duck, extends from the west coast of Greenland to the West Indies and has two tributary routes which cut across other flyways. Blue-winged teal leave the Mississippl flyway near St. Louis, Mo., and join the Atlantic flyway near the coast of South Carolina. Small numbers of redheads leaving their breeding ground in northern Utah join others of their species from central Canada and head for the Maryland and

Waterfowl population of the Mississippi flyway exceeds Tripucka in the fourth quarter The rookle from Michigan got that of all others. The flyway, like a giant funnel, brings huge numbers of mallards and pintails from the Canadlan Arctic to the lower Mississippi valley and the Gulf of Mexico.






