## Tricks, Not Only Points Should Always Be Counted

Mr. Abel tells me he has a complaint. Using the Dynamic Point Count method, he and his partner had a total of 31 points in today's deal. With three points equal to one trick, he figured he should have won 10 tricks. But he took only eight.

the rest of the tricks for a one-trick set.

Let me remind Mr. Abel that when he is in a three no trump contract, the first job is to make sure of nine tricks—no matter how many points or playing tricks he has. He could have enjoyed that result on this hand if he had handled the play correctly. At trick two he should have led the trey of spades from the board and finessed the nine.

Even if this lost, four spade tricks were absolutely assured and the lead would be in Mr. Dale's hand from which a club return would not be fatal. Four spades, three hearts, a diamond, and a club would be enough for the contract.

As it happened, the nine of spades would win and Mr. Abel would take ten tricks after all—the exact number his point count total had promised.

## Motorists Fined At Port Edward

Four motorists and one city transfer company were charged with driving infractions in Port Edward police court Thursday afternoon and Friday morning.

Port Edward RMP reported.

A 35-year-old city taxi-driver was fined \$10 and costs or in default sentenced to 10 days in jail when he pleaded guilty to operating a taxi in contravention to his motor carrier licence. Police said, William Edward Ehrussall of 836 Summit Avenue was charged February 16 after he was found to have six passengers in his cab. His licence restricts passenger carriage to five persons.

A 21-year-old man, Victor Ruzyski of 238 Sixth Avenue West was fined \$25 and costs or in default sentenced to 10 days in jail when he pleaded guilty to driving without due care and attention.

Police said Ruzyski was charged following an accident on Highway 16 two miles past the city limits January 30 in which he collided with another car driven by Marcel Girardot. Both cars careened off the road into a ditch. Damage to both vehicles was estimated at \$1,150.

Two other city men, George Murray Robertson of 221 First Street and Patrick William Wilson of 418 Dunsmuir Street, were fined \$30 and costs or in default sentenced to 14 days in jail when they were found guilty of speeding.

Yesterday morning, Philipott-Evitt and Company Ltd. was fined \$10 and costs after it pleaded guilty through counsel A. Bruce Brown, to a charge of hiring a driver without a chauffeurs' licence.
