

LOS ANGELES (4) -- The high pressure of quarterbacking a million-dollar professional football team may be the reason for the retirement of Norman Van Brocklin of Los Angeles

after nine years with the National Football League Rams said "Nine years is a long time and I've been around that long,"

Van Brocklin, announcing his retirement Thursday night

Pete Rozelle, general manager of the Rams and a close friend of the quarterback, had an informal opinion.

Rozelle said Van Brocklin at the age of 31 was feeling the brunt of the responsibility of a field general and that with three young daughters Van Brocklin believes he should begin a business of a permanent nature, Van Brocklin was the NFL's leading passer in 1950, 1952 and

1954. He was second in 1951 and 1953.

During his pro career he completed 1,011 out of 1,897 passes. Last season he threw 265 passes, completing 132 for 2.105 yards and 20 touchdowns.
