

CHERRY JAM (using sour cherries)

Yield: about 11 medium glasses (5½ lbs. jam.) 4 cups prepared fruit (about 2 quarts ripe sour cherries)

7 cups (3 lbs.) sugar l bottle liquid fruit pectin First, prepare the fruit. Stem and pit about 2 quarts fully ripe

sour cherries. Chop fine. Measure 4 cups into a large saucepan. Then make the jam. Add sugar to fruit in saucepan and mix well. Place over high heat, bring

to a full rolling boil, and boil hard 1 minute, stirring constant-Remove from heat and at once stir in liquid fruit pectin. Skim off foam with metal spoon. Then stir and skim by turns for 5 minutes to cool slightly, to prevent floating fruit. Ladle quickly into glasses. Cover jam at once with 1/8 inch hot paraffin.

SOUR CHERRY JELLY Yield: about 11 medium glass-

es $(5\frac{1}{2} \text{ lbs. jelly.})$ 3½ cups juice (about 2 quarts ripe sour cherries)

7 cups (3 lbs.) sugar 1 bottle liquid fruit pectin

First, prepare the juice. Stem and crush thoroughy (do not pit) about 2 quarts fully ripe sour cherries. Add 1/2 cup water; } oring to a boil and simmer, covered, 10 minutes.
