





Mantle, the most valuable player of the American League for the last two years, agreed to terms after meeting with Lee Macphail, director of personnel. The outfielder hit .365 last year. In 1956 he led the league in batting, home runs, and runs batted in.

The answer for the consumer lies in the organization of consumer co-operatives to meet his needs and to protect his interests.
