


Mr. Masters could not afford to slip at this point. Unless he led exactly the right card, Miss, Brash would make three no trump, winning four diamonds, three clubs and two spades. He reasoned it out in the following manner. Mr. New is far from the world's best, but he religiously leads the fourth highest card from his longest suit

against no trump contracts. In this case he had led the four of spades. The trey was in duminy and Mr. Masters had the deuce. Therefore, Mr. New's spade suit | consisted of four cards. He had | no suit longer than four cards or he would have led from that suit. He had shown up with a singleton diamond. There was only one distribution he could possibly have and that was 4-4-4-1. Obviously that meant he had





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





