
Nearly 100 Boxers in Record You're the OUTDOORS... Entry for 19 National Titles

CAMROSE, Alta. (CP)—The stage for the biggest Canadian amateur boxing championships in history is almost set in this city of 6,000 persons and with more than a week before fight time, May 17, the event is almost sold out.
