

Building This Year Reaches \$2,103,444

For the first time in Prince Rupert's history, value of construction sanctioned by the city within a year or less, has passed the \$2,000,000 mark.

> Main factor in boosting the total for the first 11 months this year to \$2,103,444 was the \$250,-000 permit for the Civic Centre swimming pool, taken out November as foundation work is nearing completion.

Figures compiled by Building Inspector J. C. Ewart show 33 other permits were issued last month for a total value of \$72,-800. In November 1956, 44 permits for \$57,605 were issued.
