Northern Board For Claims To Be Studied

Prince Rupert Labor Council is attempting to get a Board of Referees established in the city to deal with northern B.C. coast claims for unemployment insurance.

Secretary-treasurer J. S. Furness has written to Federal Labor Minister Milton Gregg V.C. Skeena MP E. T. Applewhite and the Unemployment Insurance Commission advancing the council's view that sufficient claims arise in this area to warrant the establishment of an appeals board.

Chief Commissioner J. C. Bissen of the U.L.C. has replied stating that, with 24 appeals arising in Prince Rupert during the past 25 months, existing arrangements appear to be satisfactory.

He promised however, to keep the matter constantly under review and to consider establishing a board if it becomes warranted by circumstances.
