Genereux didn't win a major event, his best showing was second in the singles. Neither did Blanchett, whose best was a second in the doubles.

But veterans here look upon ithe two as big winners for Canada in future Olympics.

Floyd Nattrass, Calgary, was the winner of the Canadian singles title when he fired perfect scores on the last 200 of the 500. target event.

Nattrass, a noted coyote hunter, scored 486, just one more than Genereux who moved into second spot on the basis of two
