PIPELINE COMPLETED — The final weld is made in the 650mile, \$170,000,000 natural-gas pipeline from the Peace River fields of western Alberta and eastern British Columbia to Vancouver and the international border. The weld was made at Mile 119.5, close to the geographical centre of B.C. The line was built by Westcoast Transmission Company. Gas will start moving in September. The line will connect with the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation's line, delivering gas to the Pacific coast states.
