## EXTRACTS FROM AN ADDRESS DELIVERED BY HON. W. L. MACKENZIE KING AT PRINCE RUPERT, OCT. 20, 1920.

"Was the G.T.P. policy a wise one?" asked Mr. King. "What was Sir Wilfred's vision when the transcontinental railway was being planned, and his vision of this particular city? I KNOW," said Mr. King. "IT WAS OF SHIPS PLYING FROM THIS VERY HARBOUR CROSSING THE PACIFIC WITH THE PRODUCTS OF THIS COUNTRY, BRINGING BACK OTHER COMMODITIES HERE, MAKING THIS COMMUNITY ONE OF THE GREATEST MARTS IN THE WORLD; of a railway running through a country as fertile as any in the world, the feeders running north and south, tapping the resources of the province, mineral and timber, the national wealth; a great community with ocean wharves, docks, repair yards, drydocks, round houses, hotels, railway stations and all the sights and signs of a great world metropolis."

"AND WHAT HAVE YOU GOT TODAY?" went on Mr. King. "A SIDE LINE AND NOT A MAIN ARTERY! THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE LIBERAL AND CONSERVATIVE PARTIES."
