

BRITISH NEWSPAPERS FRET OVER CRITICISM OF QUEEN

LONDON (Reuters)— British newspapers for the third consecutive day today continued to fret and fume over a Conservative aristocrat's criticism of the Queen, her mannerisms and her court.

Most papers agred that 33-year-old Lord Altrincham's remarks were exaggerated-but they did contain a grain of truth in that the palace should not be cut off from modern life. The Oxford-educated peer stired up a storm of angry -comment here last week in an outspoken article on the Queen in the National and English Review, a small-circulation perlodient he edits.

In the article, Altrincham, who calls himself a "radical Tory," described the Queen's manner of speaking as a "pain in the neck," her utterances as those of a "priggish schoolgirl." The nation's Sunday press joined the debate with comaments on the article ranging from the Independent Observer' ""schoolboyish" to the leftwing Reynolds News' "refreshing." . The Liberal Manchester Guardian says there would have been little notice taken of the article "if there was not in hinny people's minds a notion that any criticism of the Royal Family is a sort of sacrilege,"
