

TESTS ESSENTIAL SAYS CIVIL DEFENCE HEAD

LAS VEGAS, Nev. MM—Canada's civil desence co-ordinator says he fels atomic tests are "absolutely essential." Maj.-eGn. F. F. Worthington, Canada's civil desence coordinator, told a press conference he would like to see such tests conducted in aCnada—in order to try them under cold

weather conditions. Gen. Worthington, who witnessed an atomic explosion at the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission's proving ground northeast of Las Vegas, said the tests are "absolutely essential for the protection of our land—of our part of the world."

He said U.S. AEC and civil defence officials should "stop all this poppycock about fallout, weather and radiation, and tell the people of the world—in strong language—the truth about the tests... and the importance of continuing the tests. The general said Canada had never received any fallout "to speak of" from the Nevada tests. He indicated he felt the radiation dangers had been exaggerated.

Thirty-one civil desence experts from nine foreign nations attended the press conference under auspices of the AEC and the federal civil defence administration.
