



Line 9-inch pie pan with pastry. Combine sugar, salt and spices, sprinkle over apple slices in bowl, toss to mix well. Place apple mixture in pan, heaping apples somewhat in centre of pie. Dot with butter.

Cover with top crust, flute rim. Bake in 425° F, oven for 40 to 45 minutes or until apples are tender.


