### Tories, CCF "Soon Happy To Forget Role"

BRANTFORD, Ont.—(O)—Prime Minister St. Laurent said Tuesday he is sure the Progressive Conservatives and CCF will soon be "most happy" if Canadians forget the part those parties played in last year's hectic Common pipeline debate.

Opening a whirlwind Ontario tour, the Liberal leader defended his government's use of "closure," a parliamentary device to limit the heated debate and allow passage of a bill to provide a federal loan to finance Prairie construction of the Alberta-Montreal natural gas pipeline. The loan since has been repaid with interest.

The Progressive Conservatives and CCF parties had charged the government with gagging Parliament and with opening the way to profiteering by American promoters. But Mr. St. Laurent criticized those opposition parties for their attempts to "talk out" the legislation.

#### DEFENDS CLOSURE

He said it was Conservative Premier Frost and Treasurer Dana Porter of Ontario who were so convinced of the need for this project that they urged the Liberal administration to get on with it.

"We had to be thankful to another Conservative, Sir Robert Borden, when he was prime minister, for bringing into use in Canada a well-known British institution, closure."

"If this parliamentary procedure—which experience has shown to be a necessary device of orderly democratic rule—had not been available to the government, and if the government hadn't had the courage to use it—after it was given solemn warning by the gentleman who now is the leader of the Tory party, as well as by others of the filibuster that was coming—the pipeline would not now be under construction."

Mr. St. Laurent, 75, opened his southwestern Ontario campaign in this home of Senator Ross Macdonald, former Commons Speaker and now government leader in the Upper Chamber. The prime minister will make 15 stops in four days. Today he also planned to speak at Paris, Galt and Guelph.

Ottawa is a crucial political battleground, holding 85 of the 265 seats in the Commons. At dissolution of Parliament, the Liberals had 49 of the 85; the Conservatives 33. There were three vacancies.

## B.C. Army Inspections To Start Sunday May 26

VANCOUVER — Annual inspection of Regular and Militia Units in British Columbia, by Major General Chris Vokes, general officer commanding, Western Command, will start later this month.

Due to arrive Friday, May 24, he will leave the next evening for Vancouver Island. First units to be inspected will be Nanaimo Garrison on Sunday, May 26 when the parade will be led by Brigadier J. S. Adam, Commander 25 Militia Group.

The 4th Light Anti-Aircraft Battery, RCAF; 11 Company, Royal Canadian Army Service Corps; 3rd Field Squadron, RCE and 11 Works Company, RCE will be visited on Monday, May 27.

The 2nd Battalion, Queen's Own Rifles of Canada, will parade in full ceremonial dress Tuesday in Victoria. General Vokes will leave the next evening for Vancouver.

On Thursday, May 30 he will visit Vancouver Wireless Station at Ladner and 1 Field En-

gineer Regiment at Chilliwack. A ceremonial parade will be held at Chilliwack led by Lt.-Col. D. R. Rochester, Commanding Officer of 1 Field Eng. Regiment.

The next day a ceremonial parade will be held at Chilliwack by members of the Royal Canadian School of Military Engineering, this parade will be commanded by Colonel R. J. Carson, School Commandant.

On Sunday afternoon, June 2, Militia units in Vancouver will parade at Brockton Point, Stanley Park, where a religious service and inspection will be held.

Parade commander will be Brigadier D. M. Clark, Commander of 24 Militia Group.

Final inspection will be on Monday at Headquarters, B.C. Area, where Headquarters Personnel, 11 Detachment, RCMC; 214 Workshop, RCFME; 11 Works Company, RCE; 11 Company, RCASC and No. 8 Ordnance Ammunition Depot will parade.

General Vokes will leave by train that evening for Edmonton.




