Whether or not Mr. Sommers has a case is not the point at the moment. We must take the word of those close to him that he is a sick man and that if he is obliged to appear in court before he is ready, the outcome may be far more serious than the terms of case warrant.

Regardless of the manner in which he handled his duties as minister of lands and forests, the price paid by Mr. Sommers for his brief entry into public life has been a severe one. Mrs. Sommers reports that for reasons of both health and money, the last two years have been a "terrible strain."

Somehow the feeling persists that if Mr. Sommers had received more support and guidance from his government when the critical events leading to his resignation were taking shape, this later ordeal might have been avoided. It was obvious that in the rough game of politics, Mr. Sommers was about as naive as they come but there seemed to be little excuse for the conspiracy of silence that surrounded him when he suddenly found himself under fire. He was made to look like an outsider who had somehow made his way into the legislature unrecognized and unasked rather than as a cabinet member with an important post of duty.

Responsibility for his present state of affairs must be shared by others who once considered themselves as his colleagues.
