

Therefore it is dangerous for you to take any important action in the other major unless you have a very fine suit. In today's deal Mr. Masters had a fine suit and a fine hand and he went

straight to game. Mr. Muzzy's double of two diamonds was silly. It does not pay to double an overcall with strength only in the overcaller's suit. Mr. Muzzy's action promp--ted Mr. Abel to double four

This was unwise, too. Mr. Abel should have "played" his partner and realized that Mr. Muzzy might not furnish anything of value in the defense of a heart

The ace of diamonds won the first trick. In a good effort to kill the dummy hand by eliminating its only entry, Mr. Abel then shifted to the king of clubs.

However, Mr. Masters was not stampeded into making the obvious play of winning with dummy's ace. If he had done so he would have lost the hand.

The lead would be in dummy for the last time and he would have to try to cash the king of diamonds, discarding a club or the five of spades from the eleced hand.

Mr. Abel would have ruifed! this and excited with a trump. After this exchange nothing could have prevented the defenders from winning two more

But Mr. Masters refused to win! the second trick with the ace of clubs. He let the king win but took the club continuation in his hand with the queen. Then he cashed four rounds of trumps and had the ace of clubs left as an entry to the board. On the king of diamonds he got rid of his small spade and thus lost only a spade, a club and a dia-

# CATALA'S LAST PASSENGER RUN ACCOMPANIED BY 'SAD FACES'

VANCOUVER (CP)—Captain Harry Roach of the Catala nosed his vessel into dock Wednesday at the end of the last passenger service of Union Steamships and said there were "many sad faces" along the route.

The company terminated its passenger service on the B.C. coast when the federal government refused to increase its subsidy.

Captain Roach, 59, attributed the line's troubles to "small boats" which have cut in on its services. He said the company has been "nibbled to death" by this competition.

"The government is leaving the people up there at the mercy of anyone who wants to exploit them," he said.







