

Buhl Tames Dodgers Second Time In Season

Pirates Score Against Redlegs

Milwaukee's Bob Buhl still has the Brooklyn Dodgers on a string. Cincinnati's Joe Nuxhall still is "all goofed up," and the National League pennant race is still a tight little sprint, with only a three-game spread covering the first five teams.

Only two games were scheduled in the league Monday night, and Buhl, who beat the Dodgers eight times last year, wrapped them up, for a second time this season, 3-1, with a somewhat anxious four-hitter.

This left Brooklyn and the Braves in a tie for third place, 1½ games behind first-place Cincinnati.

Pittsburgh and Vern Law took care of the Redlegs, with Law also spinning a four-hitter that beat Cincinnati, 5-2. It was the first Pirate success against the Redlegs in 18 games and left the leaders only one game ahead of Philadelphia Phillies.

DETROIT DUMPS YANKS


Boston Red Sox, with Dick Gernert driving in six runs, walloped Kansas City 11-4 in the only other game in the American League Monday.






