Did you ever hear of a man looks?


A Christian magazine recently reported the experience of an English farmer who told a companion as they were walking through his fields together, "You know, I was saved by my good looks."

To his surprised friend, he explained that not long ago, he had attended a church service and this is what happened.

"The preacher gave out as his first text, 'Isaiah 45:22,' 'Look unto me, and be ye saved; for I am God and there is none else.' He pictured the cruel cross and Jesus bearing the sin of the world. Sitting there I gazed at the amazing sight and with my inner eyes of the soul I SAW HIM DYING FOR ME."
