# Withdrawal Threatened

TEJUANA, Mexico (AP)—Three U.S. Professional Golf Association players threatened to withdraw from the \$15,000 Callente Open golf tournament because of gambling on the event but sponsors of the event said an agreement was reached late Tuesday.

Professionals Jay Hebert, Mike Souchak and Jackie Burke were reported to have threatened to boycott the 72-hole tournament, which opens Thursday.

Spokesmen for a sponsoring brewery and horse race track said such protests were based on the belief that pari mutual gambling was to be conducted at the golf club.

Final qualifying for the open was completed Tuesday with 37 players scoring one-over par 73 or less to gain a berth in the tournament.

Leading the qualifying rounds was amateur George Knudson, 19, of Winnipeg. He scored a 67.

# Bidding By Opponents Helps Decide Timing of Play

In trying to decide how to time the play of a hand, the adverse bidding is often of the utmost importance.

In today's deal, for example, suppose the opponents had never entered the bidding. Since Mr. Masters had eleven tricks in hearts, spades and clubs, he might have simply led up to dummy's king of diamonds, hoping the ace was in Mr. Abel's hand. That play would have been a 50-50 shot.

But after Miss Brash's overall it was practically certain the ace of diamonds was behind the king. In other words the line of play described above would lose. Thus, with the aid of Miss Brash who hates to be shut out of the auction, Mr. Masters found the winning play.

The nine of clubs was opened by Mr. Abel, covered by dummy's ten, Miss Brash's Jack, and won in the closed hand with the king.

Mr. Masters timed the play of the trumps correctly, cashing the king first, then leading to dummy's ace. If he had carelessly taken both trump tricks in his own hand, leaving the lone ace on the board, he would have had no convenient entry back to his own hand and the play he had in mind would not have been possible.

Beginning at trick four Mr.

Masters cashed the ace and the king of spades. He re-entered his hand with a trump and cashed the queen of spades, discarding a small diamond from dummy. Then he led out all of his remaining trumps, leaving on the board the king of diamonds and the ace and eight of clubs.

At this point it was fairly clear Miss Brash's last three cards were the lone ace of diamonds and the once-guarded queen of clubs. Mr. Masters therefore led a diamond at the eleventh trick and Miss Brash was in a forced lead into dummy's ace.

# Aragon Faces Arraignment Feb. 7 On Offering Money To Throw Fight

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Third-ranking welterweight Art Aragon is again up to his scared eyebrows in trouble and publicity — and this time he isn't laughing it off.

Conspicuously missing was his usual jaunty manner when he surrendered Tuesday on a county grand jury felony indictment charging that he offered boxer Dick Goldstein \$500 to throw a fight.

"I welcome this opportunity to present my side of this story, the sober-faced Aragon told newspaper men.

Booked on a charge of corrupt sporting practices, Aragon faces arraignment Feb. 7.

CALLED OF BOUT

Goldstein, an unranked welterweight, charged that Aragon offered him the money to take a fourth-round dive in a scheduled 10-rounder Dec. 18 in San Antonio, Tex.

Aragon bowed out of the bout, blaming illness.

"This hits me right where it hurts—in the pocketbook," said Aragon. "I had a bout lined up for Jan. 29 at the Legion Sta-

dium with Chico Vejar and another next month with Kid Gavilan.

"Sure, they're definitely off," he added. "Even if the commission would let me fight, I couldn't—not with this hanging over my head."

SECOND BRUSH

This is Aragon's second brush with fight-fixing charges. Tommy Campbell, onetime lightweight, told a special governor's commission investigating boxing in California last spring that he "lost on purpose" to Aragon in 1950.

Aragon testified in his own defence then and, between sobs, convinced the commissioners that he was not involved.

"The punch I hit him with would have knocked out anyone," he said at the time.
