The general procedure followed was: have the planking as clean as it is possible to get it. If it is an old hull all parts should be stripped down and wiped off with a good standard cleaning solvent like Varsol—not gasoline. This cleans off all

grease and dirt Make a slow mix of resin—that is, don't add quite as much activator. Other than that, all mixes should be standard mixes and don't mix too much at a time. If two people are working on the hull, a pint at a time is enough. A quart for three or

One coat of the slow mix is applied, allowed to soak in and left overnight. A heavy layer of resin is applied next. For this layer the experts say: Don't put it on like paint, shovel it on.

Lay sibre glass material into resin when it has become slightly tacky. Roll down and work out all the air bubbles. Shovel on another layer of resin and work well into fibres of material until all the white tinge has disappeared. Watch

Two more coats of resin are applied and worked into all the hollows in the material. In the last coat, color may be added.




